Are You Smarter than a 5th Grader?

Introduction to the Old Testament — Room A

Our 5th Graders at Trinity spend the entire year studying the Bible. So... "Are you smarter than a 5th grader?"

If you're not sure, come to the Introduction to the Old Testament, at 10:15 in Room A. Please bring a Bible. Donald Grigg's The Bible From Scratch; The Old Testament for Beginners is recommended but not required. (Copies are available in the Bookshop.) NO KNOWLEDGE OF THE BIBLE IS REQUIRED. We start with the basics (What is the Bible? What does "OT stand for?" "Where do you find it in the Bible?") and move on to spend a few weeks on the Pentateuch (1st 5 books); the Prophets (a lot of fun!) and the Writings. All of this from June 7 - August 16. (No you don't have to attend all the classes.) Jerry Paré will teach the course. Jerry has a Master of Arts in Scripture from The Claremont School of Theology, Claremont CA.
