

CALL TO WITNESS: Join the faith community, Labor and other low-income housing advocates at **5:30 pm, Tuesday, September 1 at City Hall (915 I Street)** to take a stand for a JUST Affordable Housing Ordinance to create desperately-needed housing for low-income families in our community. This has been a very long uphill fight. After several years of community input, review and discussion, members of the Sacramento City Council will finally be VOTING on a revised Affordable Housing Ordinance. The future of affordable housing in Sacramento is in their hands. We are challenging our elected officials to include fees high enough to realistically generate funds for affordable housing, requirements that 50 acre properties be included in the requirements rather than being exempted, and to remove automatic exemptions for conversions of commercial property to residential.
